3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Springfield 1908 Race

5 Riot National Monument Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) COMMISSION.—The term “Commission”

9 means the Springfield 1908 Advisory Commission

10 established by section 3(h)(1).

11 (2) MAP.—The term “Map” means the map en-

12 titled “Springfield 1908 Race Riot National Memo-

1 rial Proposed Boundary”, numbered 687/148588,  
2 and dated February 2023.

3 (3) NATIONAL MONUMENT.—The term “Na-  
4 tional Monument” means the Springfield 1908 Race  
5 Riot National Monument established by section  
6 3(a)(1).

7 (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
8 the Secretary of the Interior.

9 (5) STATE.—The term “State” means the State  
10 of Illinois.

11 **SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF SPRINGFIELD 1908 RACE RIOT**

12 **NATIONAL MONUMENT.**

13 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2),  
15 there is established in the State the Springfield 1908  
16 Race Riot National Monument as a unit of the Na-  
17 tional Park System to preserve, protect, and inter-  
18 pret for the benefit of present and future genera-  
19 tions resources associated with the Springfield Race  
20 Riot of 1908 and the role of the Riot in the forma-  
21 tion of the National Association for the Advance-  
22 ment of Colored People.

23 (2) CONDITIONS.—The National Monument  
24 shall not be established until the date on which the  
25 Secretary determines that sufficient land has been

1       acquired within the boundary of the National Monu-  
2       ment to constitute a manageable unit.

3       (b) BOUNDARIES.—

4             (1) IN GENERAL.—The boundary of the Na-  
5       tional Monument shall be the boundary generally de-  
6       picted on the Map.

7             (2) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map shall be  
8       on file and available for public inspection in the ap-  
9       propriate offices of the National Park Service.

10       (c) ACQUISITION AUTHORITY.—The Secretary may  
11       acquire land or interests in land located within the bound-  
12       ary of the National Monument by—

13             (1) donation;

14             (2) purchase with donated or appropriated  
15       funds; or

16             (3) exchange.

17       (d) ADMINISTRATIVE SITES AND VISITOR FACILI-  
18       TIES.—To facilitate the administration of the National  
19       Monument, the Secretary may acquire or lease facilities  
20       for the administration of the National Monument and to  
21       provide visitor services outside the boundary, but within  
22       the vicinity, of the National Monument.

23       (e) ADMINISTRATION.—

24             (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall admin-  
25       ister the National Monument in accordance with—

1 (A) this Act; and

2 (B) the laws generally applicable to units  
3 of the National Park System.

4 (2) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—Not later than 3  
5 years after the date on which funds are first made  
6 available to the Secretary for the preparation of a  
7 management plan for the National Monument, the  
8 Secretary shall prepare a management plan for the  
9 National Monument in accordance with section  
10 100502 of title 54, United States Code.

11 (f) MEMORIAL.—The Secretary may accept the dona-  
12 tion of a permanent memorial to the victims, survivors,  
13 and descendants of survivors of the Springfield Race Riot  
14 of 1908, to be located within the boundary of the National  
15 Monument.

16 (g) AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary may enter into  
17 agreements with—

18 (1) the city of Springfield in the State or other  
19 public or private entities for the purpose of man-  
20 aging and operating National Monument facilities  
21 for administration and visitor services authorized  
22 under subsection (d); and

23 (2) other public or private entities for the inter-  
24 pretation of sites associated with the Springfield

1 Race Riot of 1908 located within or outside the  
2 boundary of the National Monument.

3 (h) SPRINGFIELD 1908 ADVISORY COMMISSION.—

4 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established an  
5 advisory commission, to be known as the “Spring-  
6 field 1908 Advisory Commission”, to advise the Sec-  
7 retary with respect to the management and develop-  
8 ment of the National Monument.

9 (2) MEMBERSHIP.—The Commission shall be  
10 composed of 11 members, to be appointed by the  
11 Secretary, of whom—

12 (A) 3 members shall reside in the city of  
13 Springfield or Sangamon County in the State;

14 (B) 3 members shall be appointed after  
15 consideration of recommendations submitted by  
16 the Governor of the State;

17 (C) 3 members shall be appointed after  
18 consideration of recommendations submitted by  
19 the Mayor of the city of Springfield in the  
20 State; and

21 (D) 2 members shall be appointed who  
22 have experience in the field of historic preserva-  
23 tion or the purposes for which the National  
24 Monument was established.

25 (3) TERM.—

1 (A) IN GENERAL.—A member of the Com-  
2 mission shall be appointed for a term of 5  
3 years.

4 (B) SUCCESSORS.—Notwithstanding the  
5 expiration of a 5-year term of a member of the  
6 Commission, a member of the Commission may  
7 continue to serve on the Commission until the  
8 date on which—

9 (i) the member is reappointed by the  
10 Secretary; or

11 (ii) a successor is appointed by the  
12 Secretary.

13 (4) CHAIRPERSON.—The Commission shall have  
14 a Chairperson, who shall be elected by the members  
15 of the Commission.

16 (5) BYLAWS.—The Commission shall adopt  
17 such bylaws as the Commission considers necessary  
18 to carry out the duties of the Commission under this  
19 subsection.

20 (6) VACANCIES.—A vacancy on the Commission  
21 shall be filled in the same manner in which the origi-  
22 nal appointment was made.

23 (7) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of  
24 the Commission shall constitute a quorum.

25 (8) COMPENSATION.—

1           (A) IN GENERAL.—Members of the Com-  
2 mission shall serve without compensation.

3           (B) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Members of the  
4 Commission shall be allowed travel expenses, in-  
5 cluding per diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates  
6 authorized for an employee of an agency under  
7 subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United  
8 States Code, while away from the home or reg-  
9 ular place of business of the member in the per-  
10 formance of the duty of the Commission.

11          (9) FACA NONAPPLICABILITY.—Section  
12 1013(b) of title 5, United States Code, shall not  
13 apply to the Commission.

14          (10) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall  
15 terminate on the date that is 12 years after the date  
16 of enactment of this Act.
