I am pleased to offer this letter of support on behalf of Tenaska for the Tri-State CCS Hub proposal, as submitted by the Southern States Energy Board (SSEB) in response to the United States Department of Energy (DOE) Funding Opportunity Number DE-FOA-0002711, Carbon Storage Assurance Facility Enterprise (CarbonSAFE), Area of Interest (AOI 1), Phase III Site Permitting and Permitting.

As you know, CarbonSAFE Initiative projects facilitate the development of geologic storage sites for the secure storage of over 50 million metric tons (MMT) of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emitted from industrial sources. The CarbonSAFE program enhances our understanding of various aspects of CCS project screening, site selection, characterization, baseline monitoring, verification, accounting (MVA), and assessment procedures. These initiatives also focus on acquiring the necessary information for permit submissions and designing effective injection and monitoring strategies for large-scale commercial projects.
