3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.		
4	This Act may be cited as the "New Philadelphia Na-		
5	tional Historical Park Act".		
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.		
7	In this Act:		
8	(1) Park.—The term "Park" means the New		
9	Philadelphia National Historical Park established by		
10	section 3(a).		

1	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
2	the Secretary of the Interior.
3	(3) STATE.—The term "State" means the State
4	of Illinois.
5	SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW PHILADELPHIA NA-
6	TIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.
7	(a) Establishment.—There is established in the
8	State as a unit of the National Park System the New
9	Philadelphia National Historical Park.
10	(b) Purpose.—The purpose of the Park is to pro-
11	tect, preserve, and interpret the historic resources associ-
12	ated with the town of New Philadelphia, the first town
13	in the United States planned and legally registered by a
14	free African American before the Civil War.
15	(c) Boundary.—The Park shall consist of the ap-
16	proximately 124.33 acres of land within the boundary gen-
17	erally depicted as "Legislative Boundary" on the map pre-
18	pared by the National Park Service entitled "New Phila-
19	delphia National Historic Site Proposed Boundary", num-
20	bered 591/176,516, and dated July 2021.
21	SEC. 4. ADMINISTRATION.
22	(a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer
23	land within the boundary of the Park in accordance
24	with—
25	(1) this Act; and

1	(2) the laws generally applicable to units of the
2	National Park System, including—
3	(A) section 100101(a), chapter 1003, and
4	sections 100751(a), 100752, 100753, and
5	102101 of title 54, United States Code; and
6	(B) chapter 3201 of title 54, United States
7	Code.
8	(b) Cooperative Agreements.—
9	(1) In General.—The Secretary may enter
10	into cooperative agreements with the State or other
11	public and private entities—
12	(A) to coordinate preservation and inter-
13	pretation activities within the Park; and
14	(B) to identify, interpret, and provide as-
15	sistance for the preservation and interpretation
16	of non-Federal land within the boundary of the
17	Park and at sites in close proximity to the Park
18	that are located outside the boundary of the
19	Park.
20	(2) Public access.—Any cooperative agree-
21	ment entered into under paragraph (1) to provide
22	assistance to non-Federal land shall provide for rea-
23	sonable public access to the non-Federal land.
24	(c) Acquisition of Land.—

1	(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2),
2	the Secretary may acquire land and interests in land
3	for inclusion in the Park by—
4	(A) donation;
5	(B) purchase with donated or appropriated
6	funds; or
7	(C) exchange.
8	(2) LIMITATION.—Any land owned by the State
9	or a political subdivision of the State may be ac-
10	quired for inclusion in the Park only by donation.
11	(d) Technical and Preservation Assistance.—
12	The Secretary may provide public interpretation and tech-
13	nical assistance for the preservation of historic structures
14	of, the maintenance of the cultural landscape of, and local
15	preservation planning for, related historic and cultural re-
16	sources within the boundaries of the Park.
17	(e) Management Plan.—Not later than 3 fiscal
18	years after the date on which funds are first made avail-
19	able to carry out this Act, the Secretary, in consultation
20	with the State, shall complete a general management plan
21	for the Park in accordance with—
22	(1) section 100502 of title 54, United States
23	Code; and
24	(2) any other applicable laws.
